



Greetings to all.

Today's Gospel reading makes me think of happiness, and joy, and gratitude. Have you ever had just a great day, one of those days where everything-or everything that mattersseems right, and sometimes even better than right? Like the day of giving birth to your child and holding your baby in your arms for the first time or the day that you see your loved ones after a long separation...

I was thinking about these kinds of days when I read the reading for today. They are about radiance, joy, and thanks. That kind of day that happens to the man and the merchant in our gospel reading of this Sunday. You can imagine how happy is the man who suddenly find a treasure of the field, or a merchant who has been searching so hard for a fine pearl that he loves, now he finds it. They all so happy that nothing else matters for them at that moment. They willingly to do anything to possess it. How wonderful it is to have that kind of experience in our life.

We are very fortunate, we do not have to look hard for it. This kind of joy is always available for us in the person of Jesus, of God himself. Jesus reminds us in the parables that He is our treasure, is our finest pearl. When we come to Him, we will experience the incredible joy. The joy is so priceless that we can even forgo the compensation, reward, or anything in exchange for that experience.

Yet, life oftentimes is hard. Our worries and concerns of day to day life overburden us, our health conditions or of someone we love troubles us, our lives seem never ending with challenges...It also doesn't often seem to give us abundant opportunities for joy. At these moments specially, we need to come to Him, talk to Him, invite Him into our life, into our family, into our struggles. Jesus expresses clearly in the gospel reading today, when you encountered with him. We will experience an incredible joy, nothing in life can compare with it.

When we enter into a deeper relationship with our Lord, who is Himself the pearl beyond price, other attractions in life seem far less appealing. Like the merchant we're prepared to forego things which we once thought we couldn't live without. St Paul in his letter to the Philippians tells us this kind of experience: "I consider everything in life as so much rubbish compared to the true joy of knowing Jesus Christ my Lord. For him I have accepted the loss of everything".
