
FATIMA NEWS

27th & 28th Sundays in Ordinary Time Year A 8th & 15th October 2023

Greetings to all,

Today's gospel reading is largely a story of rejection, with Jesus speaking about the wicked tenants. The vineyard owner sends two groups of servants to collect the vineyard's produce, but they are rejected and some of them are killed. He sent his son with the full expectation that the tenants would respect him, but he was also killed.

Jesus was referring to his own experience of rejection by many of his contemporaries, which would eventually end with



his crucifixion. He is the stone rejected by the builders that Jesus mentions in the gospel reading.

Yet, rejection does not have the last word. As Jesus says, quoting one of the Psalms, the stone rejected by the builders became the keystone. God raised his rejected Son from the dead and made him the foundation or the keystone of the church.

Any little experience of rejection can leave us deflated; we can be tempted to give up. The parable suggests that God is not like that. In the face of rejection, God just keeps working away; he takes the experience of rejection, the rejected stone, and builds something new upon it. We are being reminded that God is always at work, even in the most unpromising of situations. The God of Jesus Christ is the God of life who works in a life-giving way even in situations of death. Our refusal to receive the Lord's coming, the Lord's presence, does not in any way diminish his energy to work among us for the coming of God's kingdom.

Converting from Presbytery to our parish office update:

The project of converting the presbytery to our parish office is coming to final stage. The cost of this project is about \$ 7000 which include:

- Install 2 new door locks disability compliant with exit function to entry door and first office on the RHS of entry.
- Install two new doors with glass panel to office at RHS of entry.
- Taking the storeroom door of and installing to block of the kitchen doorway.
- Install rubber ramp to lip at front door.
- Frame up ope between void in kitchen and living area, sheet in FC, add insulation and trim.
- Paint new works.

Plumbina

- Cut hole below existing sink and locate hot and cold pipe.
- Join on to Pipes and run new hot water and cold water supply pipes to sink location.
- Supply and install new single bowl kitchen sink stainless steel, new kitchen mixer tap, plug and waste and run new pvc pipe to sewer gully outside.
- Complete notifiable works forms
- Leave site clean and tidy.

With Parish Financial Council's approval, this project can commence on 23rd of this month.

LITURGY NOTES: UNDERSTANDING OF THE EUCHARIST CELEBRATION

The Liturgy of the Word at Mass

The Liturgy of the Word is the first of the two central parts of the Mass. This quote from Lectionary for Mass: Introduction expresses beautifully the role of scripture in worship:

The Church is nourished spiritually at the table of God's word and at the table of the Eucharist: from the one it grows in wisdom and from the other in holiness. The structure of the Liturgy of the Word at Sunday Mass is: First Reading, Responsorial Psalm, Second Reading, Gospel Acclamation, Gospel, Homily, Profession of Faith (Creed), Prayer of the Faithful.

The first reading is taken from the Old Testament, except in Easter Time when it comes from Acts. The psalm is a scriptural response to the first reading. The second reading comes from one of the New Testament epistles (letters).



The gospel reading is the high point of the Liturgy of the Word, so the assembly stands and acclaims Christ's presence by singing an acclamation.

The homily unfolds the tained in the readings and

mysteries of faith contained in the readings and relates it to our lives today. A short silence should follow the homily. The pattern of the Liturgy of the Word is one of dialogue - between reader and listener, between God and us. We participate in this dialogue by listening carefully to the reader and preacher, by being attentive to what God is saying to us during the readings and the homily, and by joining in the assembly's responses.




On October 18, Catholics and other Christians around the world will celebrate the Feast of St. Luke, the physician and companion of St. Paul whose gospel preserved the most extensive biography of Jesus Christ.

St. Luke wrote a greater volume of the New Testament than any other single author, including the earliest history of the Church. Ancient traditions also acknowledge Luke as the founder of Christian iconography, making him a patron of artists as well as doctors and other medical caregivers.

Luke came from the large metropolitan city of Antioch, a part of modern-day Turkey. In Luke's lifetime, his native city emerged as an important center of early Christianity. Some traditions hold that Luke became a direct disciple of Jesus before his ascension, while others hold that he became a believer only afterward. After St. Paul's con-

version, Luke accompanied him as his personal physician-- and, in effect, as a kind of biographer, since the journeys of Paul on which Luke accompanied him occupy a large portion of the Acts of the Apostles. Luke probably wrote this text, the final narrative portion of the New Testament, in the city of Rome where the account ends.
